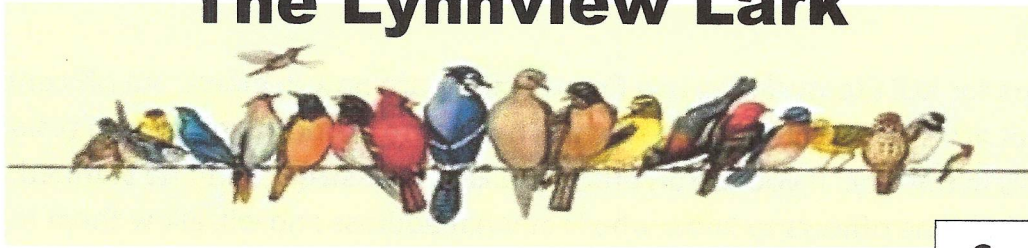

A Message from the Mayor,

READ YOUR NEWSLETTER!!!

One way to communicate with all residents is through the quarterly newsletter. We publish information for everyone about events and dates, website changes other information and public safety issues. If you are not reading these newsletters, then you are not aware of the issues and what the city is doing to resolve them. We also advise you about projects that are being worked on in the city like paving, lighting, and street signs. If you don't read this newsletter, you can only blame yourself for being uninformed. We mail things to you, we hand deliver newsletters to each home and we publish a wealth of information on the Lynnview website. Use them all to be "in the know", don't rely on the rumor mill and be misinformed.

We are working with Louisville Metro Council to address the need for new street signs throughout our city. Bids have been obtained and pricing is being negotiated. The goal is to have all new street signs in the city by the end of the year.

The city council has stated very clearly, that **ONLY RESIDENTS** can rent the community room for the resident rental fee. Relatives or friends can rent the room, but they will be charged the non-resident rate. Office staff have been instructed that no variations will be accepted. **All residents must follow the rules.** Only the person renting the room can sign the rental agreement and pay both the rental fee and the deposit by check. No cash payments will be accepted for room rentals.

Policing the City:

New summer hours for KLE (Kentuckiana Law Enforcement) are now in effect. An officer will also be acting as Sargent at arms for the council meetings. An effort to introduce officers to residents will include foot patrols in the city. If you see an officer walking your street don't be alarmed. Introduce yourself. This will help the officers to know who is at what address and will allow them to better secure our homes from unwanted intruders during their patrols.

Taxes:

In August we will begin mailing out Property Tax Statements.

Effective July 1st, 2018, NO CASH PAYMENTS will be accepted at City Hall.

**** Only checks or money orders will be accepted, and you can make your payment via credit card if you wish to do so. Use of a credit card will incur a service charge based upon the amount of the payment issued by the provider.**

City Hall Dumpsters:

There has been some illegal dumping into the city hall dumpsters. These dumpsters are monitored with video surveillance. We have a designated dumpster for yard waste and for trash. If any trash is in the yard waste dumpster it will not be picked up by Waste Management. Any violations will be submitted to Louisville Metro LMPD and Code Enforcement for prosecution. **Illegal dumping can result in vehicles being seized and/or a \$500 fine.**

Trash pick up:

All mattresses and box springs must be wrapped in plastic before being set out for trash. Waste Management **will not** pick up any mattress or box springs that is not wrapped.

Grass Cutting:

PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE be aware while cutting your grass. Make sure grass is not being cut or blown into the roadways. We have several motorcycle riders in our neighborhood, and grass trimmings on the roadway can be very dangerous for them. If a motorcyclist hits one of these patches while leaning this acts like a sheet of ice for this driver and could result in serious injuries. Let's all work together to prevent accidents in our neighborhood.

Grass should be maintained in both front and back yards below 10 inches. If your grass exceeds that level, you could be visited by code enforcement and fined. If the grass remains too high for seven days or more the city will cut it and apply a lien to the property in the amount of \$250.

Business Signs:

Business signs are being placed in yards throughout the city. The Louisville Metro ordinance states that the signs can only be displayed in a yard if a permit is obtained from Louisville Metro Zoning and Commissions. Without a permit, homeowners can be fined up to \$500 for each sign in violation of the ordinance, per day the sign remains in violation. The ordinance specifically exempts church organizations or political entities.

Recycling:

Any resident wishing to add recycling to their Waste Management pick up may now do so. If you elect to add recycling, the cost will be \$3.50 a month and will be billed directly to the homeowner/renter. IF you would like to add this service you can call Waste Management at **966-0117**. Waste Management will provide an 18-gallon bin for your recycling use.

A Caution for all residents:

Lynnview does have a no solicitation ordinance. This does not apply to church or political representatives. For your safety never answer the door for an individual you do not know. Do not hire individuals going door to door to do work on your property. In most cases, these individuals are fly by night and will be taking your money and not doing the work promised. If someone approaches you about work tell them Lynnview has a no solicitation ordinance and they should come to city hall before knocking on doors.

Ordinances:

Grass:

Grass should be maintained in both front and back yards below 10 inches. If your grass exceeds that level, you could be visited by code enforcement and fined. If the grass remains too high for seven days or more the city will cut it and place a lien on the property in the amount of \$250.

Fire Pits:

According to the Louisville Metro ordinance fire pits cannot exceed 3 feet in diameter and the structure cannot exceed 3 feet in height. Flames cannot be more than 5 feet tall. Also, they must be at least 15 feet away from any combustible structure. You cannot burn trash or rubbish in a firepit.

Trash:

The city's trash pickup day is Tuesday. No trash should be placed at roadside before Monday. All cans should be removed from roadside by Wednesday afternoon. All mattresses and box springs **must be wrapped in plastic** in order to be picked up by Waste management.

Noise:

If your device can be heard beyond a 50 ft radius, you are in violation of the Louisville Metro Noise ordinance. Please be aware of the volume of any device or instrument you may be using in order to respect the peace of other around your property.

CURFEW:

Children under the age of 18 must be off public roadways after 11:00 pm on weekdays – Sunday through Thursday. For weekends – Friday and Saturday the curfew is 1:00 am.

Parking:

ABSOLUTELY NO PARKING ON GRASS.

All vehicles parked on the street must be parked with the flow of traffic and cannot remain there longer than 24 hours.

Ordenanzas:

Césped:

La hierba debe mantenerse tanto en el frente como en el patio trasero por debajo de 10 pulgadas. Si su pasto excede ese nivel, podría ser visitado por la aplicación del código y multado. Si el césped permanece demasiado alto durante siete días o más, la ciudad lo cortará y colocará un gravamen sobre la propiedad por un monto de \$ 250.

Fogatas:

Según la ordenanza del metro de Louisville, los pozos de fuego no pueden exceder los 3 pies de diámetro y la estructura no puede exceder los 3 pies de altura. Las llamas no pueden tener más de 5 pies de altura. Además, deben estar al menos a 15 pies de distancia de cualquier estructura combustible. No puedes quemar basura o basura en una hoguera.

Basura:

El día de recogida de basura de la ciudad es el martes. No se debe colocar basura en el camino antes del lunes. Todas las latas deberían retirarse del camino el miércoles por la tarde. Todos los colchones y somieres deben estar **envueltos en plástico** para que la gestión de residuos los recoja.

Ruido:

Si su dispositivo se puede escuchar más allá de un radio de 50 pies, usted está en violación de la ordenanza Louisville Metro Noise. Tenga en cuenta el volumen de cualquier dispositivo o instrumento que pueda estar utilizando para respetar la tranquilidad de los demás en su propiedad.

TOQUE DE QUEDA:

Los niños menores de 18 años deben estar fuera de las vías públicas después de las 11:00 pm los días de semana, de domingo a jueves. Los fines de semana, viernes y sábado, el toque de queda es a la 1:00 a.m.

Estacionamiento:

ABSOLUTAMENTE NO ESTACIONAMOS EN GRASS.

Todos los vehículos estacionados en la calle deben estar estacionados con el flujo del tráfico y no pueden permanecer allí más de 24 horas.

Keeping Residents Informed

Happy 4th of July. While it is a time for celebration, we are reminded that all residents must be concerned with SAFETY for themselves, their family, their property and pets.

As a reminder, please be respectful of your neighbors. We all want to enjoy festivities with family and friends. USE CAUTION when using fireworks, especially in dryer weather conditions.

Safety guidelines have been set by state law. You can review these online by looking at the following Kentucky Regulatory Statutes: KRS 227.715 (regulations for sales) and KRS 227.702 (permitted devices). We are providing you with a few sections of special interest. Please note that it is the responsibility of homeowners to understand and follow the guidelines. If violations occur, you can be cited.

- Fireworks cannot be used within 200 feet of a structure, vehicle, or person.
- People under 18 cannot purchase fireworks.
- Fireworks may be used as long as their use does not violate any lawfully enacted local ordinance.

The Division of Fire Protection offers the following suggestions:

- Have water readily available
- Do not alter or combine fireworks
- Alcohol and fireworks do not mix. Designate as Person for proper use.
- Do not use homemade devices.
- Use common sense. Spectators should keep a safe distance.
- Obey all local laws governing use.
- Report illegal use to our local police department dispatch - 574-5471.
